HEARING AND DOING

1. ICEBREAKER: Share a recent experience of God's grace in your life.

3. Read 1 Corinthians 3:5-9. Name and describe some of the people who have built into your life. What role(s) did they play in your spiritual journey (see sermon notes points for some roles people play)?
4. Of the roles listed in Point II. in the sermon notes, which one or two are your greatest strengths in building into others around you? List a specific example of a time in which you were able to use these gifts? Which role is your weakest?
5. Read Acts 8:26-38. What are some concepts we see with Philip that apply to us today?
